HOW TO SPOT AN IMPOSTER SOCIAL MEDIA ACCOUNT

Want to learn how to spot fake Social Security social media accounts? The tips below will help you protect yourself and your family.

How fraudsters create imposter accounts

Fraudsters create imposter social media pages and accounts using Social Security-related images and vocabulary, making them appear as if they're associated with or endorsed by us. They also create imposter social media pages of Social Security and OIG officials, such as the Commissioner or the Inspector General.

Protect your personally identifiable information

We will never ask for sensitive information through social media as these channels are not secure. Sometimes, users are asked to enter their financial information, Social Security number (SSN), or other sensitive information. This is a red flag, and often an indication of a fraudulent account.

How to spot a fake social media account

Identifying an imposter account may seem difficult at first, but there are a few things you can look for right away. You will want to focus on the following:


- How many people follow the imposter page. In most cases, fake pages have a very low number of followers as compared to Social Security's official page.
- Improper punctuation.
- Links to pages not on SSA.gov.
- Advertisements for forms or other Social Security documents for a price.
- Incorrect social media handles. To view the list of our official social media channels, we encourage you to visit www.ssa.gov/socialmedia.



Your *Statement* is an easy-to-read summary of the estimated benefits you and your family could receive, including potential retirement, disability, and survivors' benefits.

If you're planning to retire, you can visit our *Plan for Retirement* webpage at **www.ssa.gov/prepare/plan-retirement**. Here you can compare how different future earnings and retirement benefit start-dates might affect your future benefit amount.

Please tell your friends and family about the steps they can take to improve their financial knowledge by exploring their personal my Social Security account. If they don't have an account, they can easily create one at www.ssa.gov/myaccount.

SOCIAL SECURITY SUPPORTS SMALL BUSINESSES

Running a small business can be a 24-7 endeavor. Managing employees, inventory, scheduling, services, and marketing can be challenging.


PRESIDENTS REPORT

I want to start by saying that the Special Attrition Package that was rolled out was not what the Top Negotiating Committee agreed to during the National Negotiations and I do not support this.

UAW/GM Vice President, Mike Booth, signed a Memorandum of Un-

derstanding agreeing to a Two Percent Cap on the number of eligible members who could take advantage of the SAP in the first Phase. He said this in a video he posted online but also said that every eligible member that wants to retire under this agreement will be able to take advantage in future phases. I have no information on when any of the other phases will be announced.

Construction for our new product, the electric vehicle drive unit, is proceeding as scheduled. There was a delay in when production would start but the construction continued as planned. Management believes that production will start later this year. It's an exciting time for our plant. The schedules for all our products are holding strong. There have been a lot of rumors surrounding GF8 but that continues to hold firm and 8

Speed RWD has been consistent.

AB1v is the problem. We are the only plant that makes this product, and the demand is very high. We recognize that puts us in a great position because having volume has always been good for us, but this also means our members that work in AB1v are working a lot of hours. We have proposed several different solutions, including adding a third shift. We will continue to try to find a solution while also trying to keep the volume of work.



Valentine's Day celebrations: The Union Label Committee honors Unions by posting Union Made Gift ideas. Hershey, Union Made in Hershey PA since 1894. In 1938 Hershey was unionized under the Bakery, Confectionery, Tobacco Workers, and Grain Millers (BCTGM) International Union.

I hope you looked for Ghirardelli Milk Chocolate Bunnies for Easter, they are made across the San Francisco Bay in San Leandro and unionized under the UFCW (United Food and Commercial Workers). In 1852 Ghirardelli was founded by Domenico "Domingo", and today this historic chocolate factory is located at Ghirardelli Square in San Francisco, this truly is a landmark.

Made in the USA, candy Russell Stover is

made in Kansas and Texas. Russell Stover's Wife Clara Stover was the actual founder in 1923 and in 1943 it became Russell Stover's Elmers Chocolate is on the list. Elmers Chocolate started as Miller Candy in New Orleans in 1855. Due to antiquated facilities in New Orleans, in 1970, they moved their company to Ponchatoula, LA. This is a great history of chocolate.






LOCAL 14 RETIREE CHAPTER

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
