I want to tell you that I am very happy to be back in our plant. The National Negotiations were difficult this time around because management did not want to give us anything. There were times when it seemed

like negotiating with us was inconvenient for them and were surprised when we counteroffered many of their proposals. After months of negotiations, we were able to secure a record contract worth over 9 billion dollars.

This December our retirees received a \$500.00 Bonus that we were successful in securing for them. They will receive this annually over the life of this agreement. There are still some details that need to be worked out such as the opening for when members can apply for the Special Attrition Package and the sign-up period for when our members would like to transfer to the Ultium Plant in Lordstown. We are hoping to hear something from the International Union in early January. I also want to thank every member that reached out to me while I was in Detroit. Your words of encouragement helped me get through some very long days. It's a perfect example of why I am proud to represent this amazing membership.

Many of our members are being called up to Labor Relations for Interviews regarding Awareline calls, again. These interviews are conducted over Zoom calls by management from Detroit. These members of management act like they are your friend by finding common ground with you and trying to put you at ease. This ploy is to make you feel comfortable and will speak freely which often leads to that member getting into trouble. I would like to remind the membership that you are not obligated to answer any questions unless you were placed On Notice. If you are called up there, immediately request your Committee Representative.

Finally, I hope all our members enjoyed their Christmas Holiday. 2024 looks like a very prosperous year for our plant.

The RBC Bank account balance on 11/30/2023, was \$2,675,875.40. The book value on 11/30/2023 was \$2,602,017.76. The actual value was \$73,857.64, higher than we can report in the Financial Statement. This is our unrealized gain, and if we cashed in our investments on 11/30/23, our payout would have been \$2,675,875.40.



This Member Spotlight is on Ron Kossow who is a retiree from the AP Parts Unit. Ron worked there from 1966 until 2002 and is the current Recording Secretary/Treasurer for the Local 14 Retirees Chapter. He has a combined total of 42 years of elected positions within our Local.

Ron was a member during the contentious AP Parts strike in 1984-85 and was arrested on Labor Day in 1984 during the strike. He told me about the strike and how some of the scabs were even brought over from jail to work. He also said that some of the supervisors crossed the strike line in the trunks of vehicles. Flat tires had to be replaced by the company because for some strange reason, nails found their way into tires that crossed the strike line. This wasn't just a Local 14 strike, "What makes Toledo a great union town was the support we received from Toledo and across the country", he said. This was a very contentious strike, but the resolution was seen as a victory. Some of our current members take for granted what we have in our agreements. There are members like Ron that came before us that were jailed, beaten and some even killed for the labor movement.

Oscar Bunch's name came up many times throughout my conversation with Ron. Oscar was the reason we won the AP Parts strike. He also said how Ray Fisher was the first 30 and out retiree because Oscar helped negotiate the provision at AP Parts. It was first negotiated with General Motors, but it did not start until six months after the ratification of the agreement. The AP Parts contract was negotiated three months later but the provision was enacted immediately. This is why our guy was the first in the auto industry to receive this well-deserved benefit that millions of auto workers had a chance to enjoy. Oscar was a very close friend to Ron and is greatly missed.

Ron retired to Long Lake in Reading Michigan in 2002, but that did not stop his union activity. He is a very active member of the Retiree's Chapter! He is one of the best union activists I know. I enjoy my conversations with him because of the history he provides about our Local. He also shows up to union meetings, retiree events, Labor Day Parades, holiday events and any other thing that is asked of him. You not only see Ron, but his sister Judy and Alice Artripp are with him also. We appreciate them and all the work that they do!
