

Earnings - The Breakdown

GM's fourth quarter and year-end 2019 earnings report will be issued Wednesday, February 5.



Earnings reports are required by the US Securities and Exchange Commission and are an important indicator of our company's performance to employees, for investors, industry analysts and others. In the weeks leading up to earnings, we'll look at a few terms you should know to help make sense of our performance. Let's first consider EBIT.

EBIT, or earnings before interest and taxes, is our company's net revenue (all the money we made) minus our operating costs (all the money we spent) in a year. EBIT is how we measure our profitability. This money determines profit sharing, bonuses, and our ability to invest in products, marketing, plant productivity and other areas that strengthen the business.

Our EBIT margin matters too. EBIT margins are when EBIT is divided by our total revenue to make a percentage. GM set a goal of 10 percent EBIT margins to meet our needs and continue to invest in our future. How can you help? Being an advocate to attract customers and seeking ways to reduce cost and complexity are two ways each of us can increase EBIT.

GM Invests \$46.7 M in Spring Hill and Tonawanda

GM is continuing its commitment to manufacturing operations as it announces a \$40 million investment in the Spring Hill Global Propulsion Systems plant and \$6.7 million in the Tonawanda Engine Plant. The funds received at Spring Hill will increase capacity of



the 5.3L V8 engines for GM's full-size truck and SUV programs. Tonawanda Engine Plant will experience improvements in manufacturing capabilities for future product programs.
